Seeking care from traditional healer

This looks like a market but not a market this represent the dragon pupu that I was using as medicine to get well. Everybody's tradition. They said, dragon in my foot... So, that we can buy it to put on the foot.... so, this is the lady who was selling the in the store.



Limited mobility and transportation to seek care

This is the motorbike that took me from my house to the hospital, because I couldn't walk by myself. When this sickness started on me, I could not walk. In Monrovia, I was in a wheelchair one year, six months, three weeks, four days. So, my daughter brought me to Grand Gedeh here. That's the feature of the motorcycle, the transport that went for me to the parking and carried me to the house. The message to people is don't give up.



Improved mobility

This is the first time when I started to stand up and walk by myself. Only my daughter there for me, She's living in Zwedru. So, I begin to walk. I told her, Mama I have to walk, let me stroll. So, that reminded me that I can walk now. I'm strolling. This photo reminds me of the time I could not walk at all. I was neglected by the family.
